I. INTRODUCTION

B. Maintaining the Integrity of the Specifications

C. Abbreviations

Define abbreviations the first time they are used in the text. Do not use abbreviations in the title or heads unless they are unavoidable.

D. Units

- It is suggested to use SI units throughout the text.
- Use a zero before decimal points: Use "0.25," (*Bullet list*)

E. Equations

Number the equations consecutively. Equation numbers, within parentheses, are to position flush right using a right tab stop as in as in the following example:

$$a + b = \gamma \quad (1)$$

Note that the equation is centered using a center tab stop. Use the style "Equation" to ensure correct formatting.

F. Authors and Affiliations

Author list should be represented by writing the names and the surnames of the authors in order. Different affiliations should be indicated by a superscript numeral next to the author surname. Affiliations should be listed underneath the author names by specifying the institute names, cities, countries, and e-mail addresses as indicated in the template.

G. Heading Styles

Styles named "Heading 1", "Heading 2", "Heading 3", and "Heading 4" should be used on a hierarchical basis throughout the text.

H. Figures and Tables

1) Positioning Figures and Tables (*Heading 3*)

Figures and tables should be placed at the top or bottom of a column unless it is unavoidable. Large figures and tables may span across more than one column.

2) Captions

Figure captions should appear below the figures, while table captions should appear above the tables. Figures and tables should be inserted after they are cited in the text.

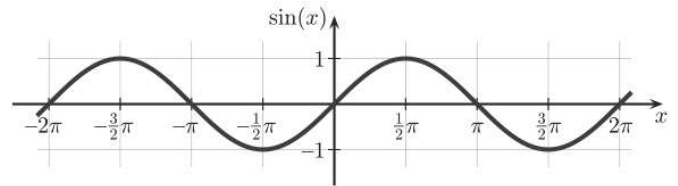


Figure 1. Example of figure caption.
